

# Safeguarding for Adults

## Overview

The aim of this course is to provide an understanding of the importance of safeguarding vulnerable people. This is designed for carers who work with users/clients within a variety of settings. This course will utilise your own in-house policies and procedures to ensure the content is embedded in your organisations ethos.

## Who will benefit?

This package is for staff within residential and domiciliary environments, family carers, personal assistants, health care assistants, support workers or senior support workers working with clients in a variety of care settings, or those people intending to work with clients with whom need assistance with their individual personal requirements.

## Course Duration

## Outcomes

This tailored programme will benefit your business by enabling staff to understand the requirements of safeguarding vulnerable people and covers some of the following topics:

- a definition of safeguarding
- to support staff to recognise who can abuse, why people may abuse and where the abuse can take place
- understanding what makes an adult vulnerable
- to enable staff to be able to differentiate the different types of abuse in the care sector, its definition and actions that lead to abuse
- to be able to recognise the signs and symptoms of abuse
- to enable the staff to recognise them in a case scenario or through practical activities
- how to identify ways and resources to help prevent abuse in your workplace, supporting it with keys to good practice
- to acknowledge the various legislation, acts and policies relating to abuse in the care sector
- to be able staff to have the necessary skills and knowledge to complete all relevant documentation for recording and reporting abuse
